ISC - Alberta Region COVID-19 Update for Chiefs: *May 26, 2020*



Updates

Importance of Testing:

Testing for COVID-19 is a key pillar to decrease the impact of this disease, particularly as we enter into the relaunch period. Testing enables early detection and effective isolation of cases and supports contact tracing and outbreak control. There are multiple strategies for testing in community e.g. drive-through testing and home visit testing and mobile testing. The most appropriate strategy is best determined by consulting with community nurses and Health Directors. The FNIHB Nursing and CDC team, including MOHs, are working with community health staff to ensure all communities can access testing locally. Testing is private and confidential and personal health information is not disclosed outside of the circle of care. Stigma and privacy concerns are two barriers that leadership can support Health staff in addressing.

First Nation Ceremonies:

Indigenous Services Canada Minister Marc Miller has made it clear that the Government of Canada will not prohibit First Nations ceremonies in the face of COVID-19, as the banning of such ceremonies in the past has been a dark stain on Canada's history. We recommend working with your knowledge keepers, ceremonial leaders and Elders to continue ceremonial practices in a way that considers the probable continued circulation of the COVID-19 virus in Alberta. Environmental Health Officers and Medical Officers of Health are here to support Nations with suggestions, safety protocols, and public health messaging as the Province of Alberta continues to have public health orders in place related to mass gatherings.

Question of the Day

Q: What supports are there for our members living off reserve?

A: In addition to the Indigenous Community Support Fund which earmarked \$15 million in support for Indigenous organizations that provide services to Indigenous peoples living in urban centres and off reserve, the government has committed \$75 million in new funding. This additional funding will support more community-based projects that address the critical needs of Indigenous populations during this crisis, including food security, mental health support services, and sanitation and protective equipment. It could also help with other needs, such as support for Elders, transportation, and educational materials for Indigenous children and youth. 
COVID-19 – Canadian Context

As of May 25, 2020, 85,103 cases have been confirmed in Canada, with 6,453 deaths. This
compares to an estimated 3000 - 4000 influenza-related deaths in Canada each year.





Cumulative total COVID-19 cases by FNIHB region and episode date*





Funding for Urban Indigenous Populations

- On March 18, 2020, the Government of Canada announced \$305 million for a new, distinctions-based Indigenous Community Support Fund to address immediate needs in First Nations, Inuit, and Métis communities. The Fund included \$15 million for Indigenous organizations and communities providing services to Indigenous peoples in urban centres and/or First Nations living off reserve.
- Indigenous Services Canada launched a Request for Proposal process for the \$15M. Over 500 proposals were received, of which approximately 400 were eligible. In total, 94 projects received funding through this initial round.
- On May 21, 2020, the Government announced an additional \$75M to support critical needs (i.e. PPE, food security, cleaning supplies) of Indigenous peoples living in urban centres or off-reserve.

COVID-19 Community Guide

- New revised Community Guide being prepared to support communities in navigating how to access supports announced by the Government of Canada for COVID-19.
- Revised Guide to include new information since version with announcements made in March.
- Document in final stages of preparation and expected to be ready for distribution via the ISC Departmental COVID-19 email distribution list very soon.
- Draft to be shared with AFN CCOH for feedback.

Personal Protective Equipment Orders

- Since the PPE request process launched February 14, 2020 summary of requests received to access the ISC-FNIHB stockpiles are below.
- Current assessment of requests 24 hours / request to storage facility to retrieve and package / shipment to community 2 – 7 days.
- Note The FNIHB emergency stockpile is for the provision of health care on reserve (including for home and community care workers and family care givers).
