Updates

Update on Indigenous Community Support Fund (ICFS):

On August 12, Minister Miller announced an additional \$305 million for the Indigenous Community Support Fund. These investments bring the Indigenous Community Support Fund to \$685 million in total. This fund provides Indigenous leadership with the flexibility needed to design and implement community-based solutions to prepare for and react to the spread of COVID-19 within their communities. It will be distributed through a combination of allocations directly to First Nations, Inuit and Métis leadership, and needs-based funding, which will be application driven. Further details will be forthcoming and we will share information with you as soon as it is received.

Education Update:

As part of the strategy to create a safe environment for children to return to school this fall, Dr. Hinshaw, Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health, is recommending that all teachers and school-based staff should get tested once before school begins in September, and regularly throughout the year, in addition to the most critical testing of anyone with symptoms. Dr. Hinshaw further recommends that Albertans who do not have coronavirus symptoms and have not been in contact with anyone diagnosed with the virus to postpone testing until September 1st, as it will allow teachers and school staff to receive their test results sooner. As you are aware, most communities have testing capacity through the Health Centres. Community nursing staff is aware of the need to prioritize this testing of teachers and school staff. In addition, school staff may access testing off reserve through completing the AHS self assessment tool. Regarding the 20/21 school year, we continue to work with your Education Directors to help support physical, mental and social health in whichever scenario your Nation chooses to implement for back to school. The ISC Education team and FNIHB are also working together on the most efficient way of flowing funding for your schools. This funding will initially cover PPE for all staff and students, as well as hand sanitization/cleaning supplies, and plexiglass barriers, etc. Communication regarding this allocation of funding will be forthcoming. Please note, that because Nominal Roll is the main driver for calculating the school funding formula, the September 30th census date and October 15th submission date is firm. These dates are firm to ensure the timely release of 2021-22 Funding Formulas

Question of the Day

Q: What further supports are available to assist our communities through COVID-19?

A: The Canada Healthy Communities Initiative, announced by Minister of Infrastructure and Communities Catherine McKenna, will provide up to \$31 million in federal funding to support community-led solutions that respond to immediate and ongoing needs arising from COVID-19 over the next two years. The Initiative will fund smaller-scale local projects under three main themes: creating safe and vibrant public spaces, improving mobility options, and digital solutions. The goal is to fund projects that quickly help communities, including rural and remote communities, adapt to the new reality of COVID-19. More information available here.
